## Call for Papers – Journal Repères

Special Issue: «Le terme: un produit social? / Terms: A Social Product?»

Special Issue Editor: Luciana T. Soliman (Università di Padova, Italy)

Recent research sees terminology as a complex phenomenon which is strictly linked to social practices. This reinstatement of a socio-discursive dimension to terms challenges the traditional Wüsterian view aimed at altogether eliminating ambiguity from communication in the fields of science and technology. The lack of terminological ambiguity envisaged by Wüster is ultimately called into question by the inherent dynamism of communication and by the changing power relations between communities of specialists. Some linguists have long predicted the impasse that a purely normative approach to terminology would reach. Terminologists and experts of communication, increasingly aware of the potential richness of synonymy and the diversity of factors involved in term creation, are questioning the alleged «transparency» of specialist discourse and the idea that negotiations between specialists can lead to univocal denominations. Terms could be better seen as the result of diverse communicative intentions and their relationship with concepts as a dynamic process influenced by social and cultural factors.

  - 2a) Aspects of reformulation (e.g. definitions, glosses and notes)

- 2) Socio-cultural aspects of terms
  - 2a) Popularisation
  - 2b) Educational aspects and access to specialist knowledge
- 3) Terms resulting from a user-oriented language policy
  - 3a) Terms and social practices
  - 3b) Standardising initiatives and the actual use of terms

# Deadline for the submission of abstracts: 30 September 2012

Abstracts should preferably be in French or, alternatively, in English or Italian. Length: 300 words (excluding references); font: TNR 12; single spacing; justified margins. Please indicate the title and the theme of the contribution (as indicated above).

Please use a separate file to indicate the following: title, name of author(s), affiliation, email address. Proposals will be selected anonymously.
